		Clarify how many days I will be in hospital
		Ask if my procedure will be under general anaesthetic, or will I have a spinal or epidural instead?
		Ask if I am likely to have any regional blocks or long-acting local infiltration in addition to the main anaesthesia
		Ask if I will be in a leg immobiliser or fixed-angle brace on discharge
		Ask if I will be discharged with a walking aid such as crutches, and how much I can weight-bear
		Get an idea of how long after surgery my regular physiotherapy sessions are likely to commence
		Ask how long it is likely to be before I will safely be able to drive again
		Make certain how I will get to and from the hospital
0		Check that the vehicle bringing me home will accommodate me if I am in a straight leg brace
		In case I need a wheelchair, check there is any need for a ramp to get me to my front door

Date	Task
	Make sure my neighbour has a spare key, in case I mislay mine
	Start a diary in pencil for arranging the transport from hospital, and follow-up visits from family and care workers
	Put into my diary the phone numbers of everybody likely to be involved in my surgery and rehab
	Put into my diary the dates (and phone numbers) for medical equipment deliveries
	Arrange for help with moving my bed to a convenient location, and check power plugs, telephone and wifi are convenient
	Make a plan for frozen meals or deliveries of food, and ask the neighbour if you think you will need help to receive the latter
